PacNW Soccer Club Announces Appointment of Forrest Marowitz as Head Goalkeeping Coach

November 5, 2018 - Pacific Northwest Soccer Club ("PacNW") is pleased to announce that Forrest Marowitz has joined the club as its Head Goalkeeping Coach. In this role, Marowitz will be responsible for overseeing the development of the club's goalkeepers, including planning the training curriculum and running regular training sessions. Marowitz will also work closely with the club's Technical Committee and coaching staff to assist in the player identification and selection process.

Marowitz joins PacNW from Eastside FC, a well-regarded youth club based in Preston, Washington. At Eastside FC Marowitz worked closely with Tom Bunnell, a "local legend" in the goalkeeping community for his long experience coaching goalkeepers. Marowitz has also been a member of the coaching staff for Issaquah High School.

"I'm very excited to have Forrest join the coaching staff of our club," said PacNW Technical Director Leighton O'Brien. "He brings lots of energy and a solid background in helping goalkeepers develop their skills and decision making ability. I'm confident that he will do great things working with our goalkeepers."

Marowitz is a local product, having grown up on Mercer Island where he played high school soccer for The Islanders. Following high school, Marowitz attended Colorado College where he played all four years for the Tigers. Marowitz's stellar performance in goal was rewarded with recognition as a first-team all conference (Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference) player during his senior year. With ten shutouts, a .868 save percentage, and a .55 Goals against average Marowitz was voted as the team's "Defender of the Year" in 2012.

"I'm grateful for the opportunity to join PacNW as its head goalkeeping coach," said Marowitz. "I know the club has a very strong group of goalkeepers and I'm really looking forward to working with them to help them improve."
