1. Welcome and Introduction – John Wilson
 - a. There are three big chunks of the soccer year:
 - June-May: Tournament Season – it’s hectic!
 - Sept-Dec: High School girls are gone, we’re kind of settled in and cruising here.
 - Jan-May: Crazy time with Winter Classic, HS boys tryouts, state cup, tryouts etc... We are in this chunk now, so hang in there with us to finish out a great year.
2. Q & A with Technical Director
 - a. All PacNW players are here and practicing now so fields are full.
 - b. High School Boys are in state cup.
 - c. After the second weekend of Winter Classic the 2020-21 slate of coaches for the high school boys’ teams will be released.

3. Winter Classic Update – Todd Johnson
 - a. There are 560+ registered teams = ALL TIME RECORD
 - b. PacNW managers do not need to do anything other than collect tournament pins.
 - c. WE NEED VOLUNTEERS!!! PLEASE HELP! Reach out to your teams and encourage them to complete their volunteer hours. If volunteer hours are complete, people can work for \$15/hour. See the PacNW website – volunteer and work opportunities are under the RESOURCES drop-down.
 - d. SNOW? - We will do everything we can do in order to play - long as it’s not unsafe, we will play!

 - a. For Winter Classic – just show up! You do not need to bring rosters. If you have guest players, let Robin know, especially if they are from another state, as she will need to get it cleared through their association.

- b. High School Boys – Robin will be printing out cards for anyone making roster changes for state cup. Presidents Cup teams can use digital cards. Champions Cup teams must use laminated cards.
 - c. State Cup Updates – Robin will register all teams for state cup – managers do not need to do it. The schedule is on the Washington Youth Soccer website – it has not been released yet for HS girls and younger boys and girls.
